Example:

Industrialization was a process that first appeared in Britain in the late 18th century. Technology began to improve manufacturing processes and with this mass production goods became more affordable as well as more available. However, unfair wages and dangerous conditions threatened the average worker while pollution as a byproduct of industrialization destroyed air/water quality.
