

VICTORIAN ERA EFFECTS

- After you have finished viewing, *The Young Victoria*, log into jchs.edu20.org and click “resources,” on our class page. Select the PowerPoint folder and then open Queen Victoria’s Family Tree.
- Look over the Family Tree and consider how many children Victoria produced. How many of her children or grandchildren became monarchs? How many different royal houses was she able to marry her family into?
- Create your own version of her family tree in a pages/word document and complete each of the following tasks:
 - Under Victoria’s name on the tree explain how her reign contributed to Britain’s involvement with the MAIN causes of WWI. (Militarism, Alliances, Imperialism, Nationalism). For each letter of the acronym you must briefly (a sentence or two) summarize a policy, action, etc. that accurately describes that ISM which occurred during her reign.
 - *For example: Victoria displayed an attitude favoring militarism when in 1840 she proposed a budget which increased military spending by 40%.*
 - For each member of the family tree who became a monarch locate a picture of them and place in the appropriate location on the tree.
 - For each country where a member of Victoria’s family reigned you must research and summarize (a sentence or two) how an action, policy, etc. contributed to the fulfillment of a MAIN ISM (Militarism, Alliances, Imperialism, Nationalism).
 - *For example: Germany displayed an attitude favoring Imperialism when Wilhelm II demanded a piece of Africa for colonization during the Berlin Conference.*

You will submit these to me by air dropping your work on Monday. Whatever you do not finish in class should be finished over the weekend for homework.

If you have time and for your own knowledge you may want to research the impact of hemophilia on several of these royal houses since Victoria unknowingly served as the carrier of that disease thus contributing to its nickname of, “the royal disease.” Hemophilia will have lasting consequences for the both the Spanish and Russian Royal Families.
